Course Description:

This course is a continuation of Elementary Hebrew 511. These two courses are an introduction to Biblical Hebrew which lay the foundation for students to acquire the ability to read and understand the Hebrew Scriptures in the original language. The second semester focuses on the Hebrew verbal system. Students will develop skills required to translate the biblical text. We will be reading and translating chapter 37 of Genesis during the semester. The course will also help students learn to use the standard Hebrew English dictionary for biblical Hebrew (Brown, Driver, Briggs).

Policies and grading:

Attendance and participation in class are required.

There will be periodic quizzes. These will be based on the material most recently covered and will be announced in class.

There will also be a final exam which will review all the material covered during the semester. Active participation in class is essential for success and will play a significant role in the grading process.
